

RAMSAR ADVISORY MISSIONS -

HELP FOR CONTRACTING PARTIES TO THE CONVENTION ON WETLANDS



What is a RAM?

- Contracting Parties to the Ramsar Convention on Wetlands have committed to *maintain the ecological character* of their wetlands.
- When the ecological character of a Wetland of International Importance (Ramsar Site) is threatened by change, the <u>Ramsar Advisory</u> <u>Mission</u> (RAM) is an effective tool for providing independent advice to find solutions.

How does it work?

- Missions can be requested by the <u>national authority</u> responsible for Convention matters in the country concerned.
- The Secretariat of the Convention, together with the national authority, and according to agreed <u>Operational</u> <u>Guidance</u>, then organizes a small team of experts to visit the site, consult local authorities and stakeholders, and produce a report with concrete Recommendations.
- Missions offer pragmatic Recommendations that can be implemented. The RAM is not a 'compliance' mechanism.
- All steps are decided by agreement with the authorities and concerned stakeholders.

Why do Parties to the Convention on Wetlands find RAMs useful?

- RAMs bring in independent specialist expertise to help solve technical problems.
- Independent advice can help to break political deadlock and find consensus.
- The process is straightforward and flexible, adapting to the needs of each case.



 Stakeholder participation is actively promoted, strengthening public support.



RAMs demonstrate a country's positive commitment to wetlands.



 Understanding and capacity to manage wetlands are enhanced as a result.



 Sharing knowledge internationally helps the Convention as a whole.



Summary of the process

The key steps are shown below. A RAM does not end when its report is produced: its Recommendations are an agenda for action, so follow-up and review are important.
