The 2016 transfers from the Ramsar core budget (28,400 CHF) were received in the end of 2016 and beginning of 2017. The 2017 first transfer in the amount of 18,000 was received in September 2017. The Project on the Update on the status of wetlands in Central Asia (Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, and Turkmenistan) by collection and dissemination of good practices for the conservation and sustainable use of wetlands by local communities was supported by the Government of Japan and its voluntary contribution of 34,554 USD. Most of the expenditures are being processed and will be used by the end of the project in April 2018.
