Observations on significant impacts of RRC-EA interventions include the active participation of RRC-EA Member Countries in regular offerings of regional, sub-regional and national trainings, as well as the growing interest of previously non-active RRC-EA Member Countries in the RRC-EA Wetland Fund. Percentage of country attendance in RRC-EA capacity building events averages at 85%, while participation of countries from South Asia in the RRC-EA Wetland Fund application process has recently been evident.
