**Narrative:** The first Steering Committee meeting and inception workshop for the Indo-Burma Ramsar Regional Initiative (IBRRI) was held on 29 and 30 March 2017 in Bangkok, Thailand. The event shared the Ramsar Regional initiative's vision with the wider wetlands community and officially launched the new regional wetlands project "Mekong WET: Building Resilience of Wetlands in the Lower Mekong Region", which will support the technical implementation of the IBRRI. During the meeting, Steering Committee members representing each of the IBRRI member countries highlighted the important role of IBRRI in assisting member countries to strengthen their capacity for implementing sound wetland management practices and policies. The Steering Committee also approved the initiative's Statutes and Operational Guidelines and programme for 2017, and explored linkages with existing Ramsar-related programmes and initiatives in the Indo-Burma Region. On the brand identity front, the initiative launched its new logo after Steering Committee members voted for their favorite design concept. With additional financial support from BMU through the Mekong WET project, the IBRRI then developed a regional tool on vulnerability assessment of wetlands, and conducted national trainings and pilot testing and implementation in ten Ramsar sites in ten countries. The IBRRI supported World Wetland Day events and the translation of the R-METT in the 5 local languages.
