developments since COP10



COP₁₀

- adopted "operational guidelines" to select, evaluate and support regional initiatives
- earmarked an amount for financial support in the core budget
- tasked Standing Committee to evaluate the initiatives and to determine individual annual financial support, and
- requested SC and the Secretariat to review the success of the initiatives and to submit a summary report to COP11

Standing Committee



SC40 (2009)

- adopted evaluation criteria and a format for annual reporting, welcomed a model letter of support for initiatives by governments and NGOs
- endorsed 12 initiatives as fully meeting the operational guidelines and operating under Ramsar in 2009-2012
- endorsed 3 initiatives provisionally for one year
- recognized 2 initiatives as being under development
- allocated annual funds to 10 initiatives for 2009

Standing Committee



SC41 (2010)

- endorsed 3 additional initiatives

 (i.e. those only provisionally endorsed for one year in 2009)
- adopted the combined format for annual reporting and forward planning
- welcomed the model contract used by the Secretariat to disburse annual core budget allocations
- allocated annual funds to 10 initiatives for activities in 2010
- approved the accrual of unallocated funds in 2010 for allocation in 2011 under the same budget line by SC42

first lessons learnt SC41 (2010)



- setting up a regional initiative takes time
- it is important to establish robust governance structures and procedures
- short and long term planning is crucial
- annual work plans and evaluation of results
- minimal reporting is required

- 9 initiatives are operating since COP10 (2008)
 centres for Eastern Africa, Central and Western Asia, Eastern Asia networks for the High Andean, La Plata River Basin, East-Asian Australasian Flyway, Mediterranean, Carpathian, Nordic-Baltic
- 3 additional initiatives are operating since 2010
 networks for the Caribbean, American Mangroves, Black Sea Coast
- 2 additional initiatives are operating since 2011
 networks for the West African Coast, Niger River Basin

summary 2009-2011 — challenges:



- 3 initiatives not to be considered any longer networks for the Pacific Islands, Himalayan, Lake Chad Basin did not evolve beyond the concept stage
- 2 initiatives need to report to SC43 (August 2011)
 centre for the Western Hemisphere currently undergoing major structural changes with reduced activities
 network for the Nile River Basin no information since SC41

require further support by the Secretariat – within our limited capacities

these initiatives could be re-considered operating under the Ramsar Convention during the period 2013-2015 - by SC46 after COP11

some more lessons ...



- developing lasting initiatives needs time
- initiatives need transparent and effective governance structures
- regular contact and timely reporting to the Secretariat is crucial
- professional structures (centres, secretariats) need to operate with a regional focus, under a regional (not national) governance structure
- all relevant stakeholders need to become active partners (not only Administrative Authorities)
- annual funds contributed by the Ramsar budget need to be spent during the corresponding year
- initiatives need to become **self-sustained** (normally after one interval between two meetings of the COP)





to Ramsar implementation

Resolution X.6 requests

"the Standing Committee and the Secretariat, particularly in relation to those initiatives funded by the core budget, to review their success and submit a summary report for consideration at COP11"

Secretariat to prepare background document for COP11 draft Resolution on Regional Initiatives 2013-2015:

- > analysis and evaluation of the work and performance of Ramsar Regional Centres and Networks 2009-2012
- > showing added value for Convention implementation
- > clarifying those issues missing in the "Operational Guidelines" or needing adjustment

Ramsar core budget funding 2011



available funds for regional initiative activities in 2011 (Budget Res.X.2):

core budget line C.i. for regional networks: 179,190 CHF

core budget line C.ii. for regional centres: 100,000 CHF

voluntary donations for African initiatives: 14,000 CHF

available total funds for activities in 2011: 293,190 CHF

requested Ramsar funding by 9 initiatives: 318,070 CHF

(shortfall of 24,880 CHF)

Proposed allocation for activities in 2011:

- > slightly reduced contributions to those initiatives which have not yet fully used all of their Ramsar funding obtained for activities in 2010
- > all initiatives are able to apply for further funds in 2012, even to recover potentially remaining small funding shortfalls in early 2012

outlook for 2012



- regional initiatives will report on progress with their work 2011 and submit a work plan for 2012 by 29 February 2012
- they include a financial budget for activities in 2012 with a possible funding request for an annual Ramsar core budget contribution
- the Secretariat will provide an update and funding proposal for 2012 to SC44 (meeting on 17 June 2012) – or SC could decide on the funding allocation via e-mail already in April 2012?



SC42 is invited to



- take note of the update on progress with the work of the regional initiatives and make possible recommendations
- withdraw consideration from three inactive initiatives (Pacific Islands, Himalayan, Lake Chad Basin) as operating under the Convention 2009-2012
- allocate annual Ramsar core budget funds for activities in 2011
- instruct the Secretariat to report to SC43 on possible funds
 (to be allocated to cover costs of regional meetings prior to COP11)
 of initiatives unable to contract for their allocation in 2011
- **instruct the Secretariat** to prepare for SC43 a performance analysis of regional initiatives 2009-2012 and a draft Resolution for COP11 on Ramsar regional initiatives 2013-2015
