Ramsar regional initiatives



the **Ramsar regional centres** for capacity building in:

- East Africa (RAMCEA) will implement its partnership development and fundraising plan
- the Western Hemisphere (CREHO) will obtain governmental support and reach financial stability
- **Central and West Asia** (RRC-CWA) will accomplish its transition, hire a director and hold the first meeting of its new **governance** board
- **East Asia** will appoint staff to increase its ability to raise and accept **funds** from donors

In cooperation with the centres, the Secretariat proposes to submit to SC48 a concept for global coordination among the regional centres, in order that they all elaborate standard and globally applicable training approaches and products that can be shared and adapted consistently.



the **Ramsar regional networks** for capacity building:

. . .

- along the **West African coast** (*WacoWet*) and in the **Niger river basin** (*NigerWet*) will develop ambitious programmes for the implementation of the Convention,
- in the High Andean, La Plata river basin and Caribbean, and focussing on American mangroves and coral reefs will establish robust funding mechanisms and administrative settings enabling them to manage their own funds,
- along the **East Asian-Australasian Flyway** has **funding** for its operations due to a strong support from its partners in the region,
- in the Mediterranean (MedWet) relocated its secretariat to France and will better integrate the work of the Mediterranean Wetland Observatory, its new coordinator will increase the ownership, support and active participation by all MedWet members,

... the **Ramsar regional networks** for capacity building:

- in the **Carpathians** (CWI) will activate its **governance** body, enlarge its membership and continue to integrate its activities into the work and finance plan of the *Carpathian Convention*,
- in the **Nordic-Baltic** region (NorBalWet) prepared a **region-wide project** with a focus on peatlands and climate change and **CEPA** initiatives, it will better integrate the work of experienced **NGOs** active in the region,
- along the Black and Azov Sea coasts (BlackSeaWet) will aim for active leadership, search the necessary funds for internationally coordinated activities and coordinated national implementation on the ground.
