Guidance for development of regional initiatives in the framework of the Convention on Wetlands

Introduction

In 2002, the 8th meeting of Ramsar's Contracting Parties (COP8) adopted *Guidelines for the development of regional initiatives* (Resolution VIII.30, cf. Annex I) as a reference against which to judge the value of regional initiatives for the implementation of the Convention. In conformity with these *Guidelines*, a number of Contracting Parties developed proposals for regional initiatives (including regional networks as well as regional centres for training and capacity building) and submitted them for the consideration of the Ramsar Standing Committee. The Committee submitted the proposals to COP9 in 2005 (information paper COP9 DOC. 21), which endorsed nine initiatives for the triennium 2006-2008 as operating within the framework of the Ramsar Convention and recognized a number of additional initiatives as having the potential to become operative within the framework of the Convention at a later stage (Resolution IX.7).

A similar procedure is now proposed for regional initiatives – ongoing or new – to obtain formal endorsement by COP10 in November 2008 as operating in the framework of the Convention during the triennium 2009-2011.

Procedure for submitting requests for COP10 endorsement and possible Ramsar funding

Contracting Parties that seek endorsement of a regional initiative by COP10 are requested to submit a proposal, following the format provided below. In order to be included in the list to be considered by COP10, the request must reach the Ramsar Secretariat not later than **31 March 2008**; it will then be submitted by the Secretariat to the 37th meeting of the Standing Committee in June 2008 for evaluation and transmittal to COP10.

The format to be used follows the structure of the *Guidelines* adopted in 2002 (attached in Annex I). Please consult the *Guidelines* when preparing your proposal. The information you provide about the initiative needs to be precise, brief, and to the point and should not exceed six pages in total.

AIM OF THE REGIONAL INITIATIVE

1. Implementation of the Ramsar approach

- 1.1 Describe briefly how your initiative is promoting the objectives of the Convention and how it is implementing the Ramsar Strategic Plan through cooperation in your region:
 - THE NORDIC-BALTIC REGION COVERS A WIDE GEOGRAPHIC AREA AND COUNTRIES, OF WHICH SOME ARE MEMBERS OF THE E.U. AND SOME ARE MEMBERS OF THE EUROPEAN ECONOMIC AREA. THE NORDIC BALTIC WETLANDS INITIATIVE (WLI) WILL MAKE IT POSSIBLE TO COORDINATE WORK WITH THE RAMSAR STRATEGIC PLAN IN THIS REGION, INCLUDING BI- OR MULTILATERAL COOPERATION PROJECTS, AWARENESS RAISING, ETC.
 - THE NORDIC-BALTIC REGION WORKS BOTH ON CONSERVATION OF RAMSAR SITES IN PARTICULAR AND ON WETLANDS IN GENERAL, ON WISE USE OF WETLANDS AND ON INTERNATIONAL CO-OPERATION RELATED TO WETLANDS.

2. Complete regional adherence and bottom-up approach

- 2.1 Describe briefly if your initiative is based on a bottom-up approach:
- At present the NorBalWet Initiative is based on annual conferences with a back-to-back arrangement (workshop) in selected issues e g management issues related to selected wetland habitats... Besides National Ramsar Authorities a wide range of NGOs, local and regional administration e g county governors environmental staff, political authorities, as well as professional environmental groups are invited to actively participate.

 An idea to include Poland and Germany has been raised (as they are Baltic Sea states).

- All countries are taking part in the initiative to a greater or lesser extent. However, it seems that several countries face a general lack of capacity (and funding?) to follow up/take part in e g workshop/meeting arranged as NorBalWet events.

 - At present the work of the NorBalWet is administered through a coordinating committee that largely represents the national wetlands administrative agencies. There is no formal document for this temporary organization, but the document from the constitution of NorBalWet in Trondheim, Norway, March 2005 gives some guidelines.
 - The secretariat and chairmanship rotates annually. The annual conferences/workshops (see 8.1) have been used as meeting places for the coordinating committee and for discussions about the future development of NorBalWet.
 - The further development of the NorBalWet administrative infrastructure will be taken after discussion with the Ramsar administration at the 6th European Ramsar Meeting in Stocholm, Sweden May 2008.

- Not yet identified, but nationally we are drawing on the partners used for national implementation of the convention.

- Acceptance of NorBalWet as a regional Ramsar initiative within the Convention on Wetlands, 2008 (COP 10).
- The establishment of a permanent administration system within 2008(2009).
- Annual conferences/workshops (separate or back-to-back with meetings of the steering group)
- More regular specific seminars.
- The establishment and running of a website for NorBalWet, <u>www.norbalwet.org</u>, 2008-2009. The website, in English will function as the initiatives communication centre on a daily basis, and link NorBalWet to the other Ramsar initiatives. It will also communicate CEPA by communicating case studies of wise-use, restoration, environmental education programs, research, and ecological tourism. (The Norwegian Directorate for Nature Management has contributed to the to the development costs for such web site (seed money only), being executed by the team planning the Dokkadeltaet National Ramsar Centre.)
- The establishment of functioning networks. Amongst others a Wetland Link International (WLI) section within NorBalWet.
- NorBalWet will investigate the establishment of NorBalWet competences.
- 7.2 Specify the relations of these targets to the objectives of the draft Ramsar Strategic Plan (attach your work plan for 2009-2011, or for 2009, where it exists):
- The ambition is to compile such a document after the sub group meeting of NorBalWet in connection with the 6th European Ramsar Meeting.

8. Raising awareness of Ramsar objectives

- NorBalWet was established at a meeting in Norway in March 2005. Since then there have been three conferences/workshop where CEPA related themes have been focused on:
 - In Sweden, May 2006, "Wetland seminar on restoration of mires and wet forests".
 - In Norway, September 2006, "Conference on restoration of wetlands in the Nordic and Baltic countries, with special focus on the restoration of deltas, lakes and rivers".
 - In Estonia, September 2007, "NorBalWet conference on the monitoring of wetlands".
 - A conference/workshop will hopefully be executed in Finland fall 2008.
- 8.2 Describe briefly the increased support for Ramsar objectives resulting from these activities (this information may be used by Ramsar's CEPA Oversight Panel, according to Standing Committee Decision 35-14):
 - As a result of contact from the conferences <u>The Dokka Delta National Wetlands</u> <u>Centre</u> in Norway, and <u>The North Vidzeme Biosphere</u> in Latvia have started wetland co-operation projects, including a large European Economic Area grant application.
 - There may also be other initiatives on which we do not have information.
