TBILISI & MTSKHETA



Explore Tbilisi, the city which has been dominated by traders, warriors, tyrants and dictators in turn. Take a walk around the old town and breathe in the living past. Visit the bustling markets, the ancient sulphur baths, the dazzling treasury, and the magnificent churches, and gain a feel for the crossing place of the Caucasus.

Then depart to the former capital to Georgia Mtskheta . Located at the confluence of the Aragvi and Mtkvari rivers, one of the oldest towns in Georgia, Mtskheta has been populated since the second millennium BC. It was the capital of the Eastern Georgian Kingdom of Iberia from the third century BC. It is thought that the name “Mtskheta” comes from the name of the “father of all Georgians, the son of Kartlos, Mtskhetos”. Mtskheta is designated as an UNESCO World Heritage Site.
