STRP participation in COP11



- 14 STRP members and invited experts were present for the COP.
- STRP presented technical briefing sessions (e.g., RIS revisions).
- STRP actively supported Parties in discussions on several key scientific and technical Resolutions and prepared revised versions of DRs for the plenary's consideration.

 NFPs Meeting: 40 participants exchanged views and recommendations on how to improve the preparation and delivery of the Convention's scientific

and technical advice.





 45 participants: appointed STRP members, invited experts, observer organisation representatives, and STRP NFPs.

 Terms of Reference to clarify roles and responsibilities and types of STRP products



 Resolution XI.8 (para. 21 ii) requested the STRP "to urgently consider" minor modifications to the RIS adopted at COP11.

 STRP recommends that no further modifications be made to the RIS format.

Draft work plan 2013-2015



Tasks are derived from Resolution XI.17, which reflects the Parties' requests at COP11.

Annex 2 of Resolution XI.17 organizes the tasks under six broad themes:

- Communication, Education, Participation & Awareness (CEPA);
- Strategic, emerging & ongoing issues;
- Wetland inventory, assessment, monitoring & reporting;
- Wetlands of International Importance (Ramsar Sites);
- Ramsar, wetlands & other sectors; and
- Wetlands & ecosystem benefits/services.

Cost estimates for STRP work 2013-2015



 Estimated costs for implementation of all top priority tasks: CHF 1,842,000 (revised from estimate of CHF 1,915,000 in Resolution X.17)

- Note three large budget items:
 - Global Wetland Observing System (GWOS)
 - Implementation of RIS 2012 revision
 - State of the World Wetlands and their services report (SoWWS)

STRP core budget 2013-2015



For each year, total of CHF 210,000

Allocated as:

Sci/Tech Support Officer: 120,000

- STRP meetings: 50,000

- Travel (STRP Chairs/DSG): 10,000

Work Plan implementation: 30,000

 STRP Oversight Committee approved annual STRP allocations

Task priorities (STRP recommendation)



- •Assess and support the capacity-building and knowledge sharing needs of Contracting Parties in implementing the Ramsar Convention (AAs & wetland managers) (2013-15/1);
- •Invasive species and wetlands guide to available guidance (2013-15/10);
- •Monitoring for change in ecological character further guidance: standardised terminology concerning Article 3.2 issues (2013-15/20);
- •Implementation of the Ramsar Information Sheet (RIS) 2012 revision (2013-15/25) led by Secretariat, with STRP's advice;

Task priorities (STRP recommendation)



- Implications of, and advice on, climate change for Convention implementation: review and advice on relevant decisions adopted by CBD COP11 (2013-15/41, iv. c);
- Ramsar, water and wetlands: review and development of a strategy for engaging in the global water debate (2013-15/44)

 this work would provide input to the preparation of the next Ramsar Strategic Plan for post-2015;
- Wetlands and poverty eradication guidance and case studies (2013-15/50); and
- Economics of wetland ecosystem benefits/services (2013-15/59).
