1.0 INTRODUCTION.

World Wetlands Day? : **2 February** each year is World Wetlands Day. It marks the date of the signing of the Convention on Wetlands on 2 February 1971, in the Iranian city of Ramsar on the shores of the Caspian Sea.

Kakungu is one of the main tributaries of Mutundu River. This River runs from Upstream Nthambiro area entering the Park at Kanjoo area. It one of the Biggest Rivers in Meru National Park; in terms of Water Volume and Size. It is therefore one of the core rivers feeding the animals throughout the year.

The Momwere Community group manages the wetlands in order to get water for irrigation and leave enough water to run down the river for downstream use in the park..This collaboration has seen the river full of water round the year.
