## Tamar Island Wetlands Centre world wetlands day 2009

## Background

Tamar Island Wetlands Centre and Reserve is a part of the Tamar River Conservation Area and is situated just outside Launceston, the second biggest city in Tasmania and located in the north of the State.

The Wetlands are regularly visited by local residents for birdwatching, recreation, exercise and showing visitors their 'special' part of the state. National and international visitors from all over the world come to enjoy the displays and information available at the Interpretation Centre and walk the 3km boardwalk which takes them out to Tamar Island, adjacent to the Tamar River.
