

European priorities *how STRP should work:*

- communicate more widely on its ongoing work
(including of its individual members and experts)
- work more in synergy (incl. co-financing) with other institutions
(EU, UNESCO, development agencies, research foundations, etc.)
- establish two-way cooperation with regional initiatives
- hold physical meetings on specific topics
- support processes for networking at local and regional levels
- complete tasks ‘in hand’, and
avoid wasting investment in issues with unknown outcomes

European priorities for *STRP outputs*:

- ◆ share more information on best practice and case studies
(electronically and on paper)
- ◆ produce easily accessible documents in a user-friendly language
(for site managers, NFPs and decision-makers)
- ◆ produce short briefing notes for specific target audiences,
avoid producing mega-reports that nobody reads
(produce translations of original texts)

European *priorities for STRP:*

- work on climate change collaboratively with other institutions
(practical proposals, avoiding disputed issues)
- work on the economics of ecosystem services
- work on wetland inventory and RS information management
- include more social science expertise
- work on how communities benefit from wetlands
(and its implications for managing change)
