WETLANDCARE NATIONAL ART COMPETITION 2008

The inaugural WetlandCare National Art Competition 2008 was held to celebrate World Wetlands Day, which occurred on 2 February 2008. The art competition was the only National event to be held in Australia to celebrate World Wetlands Day 2008. As the theme for World Wetlands Day 2008 was "Healthy Wetlands, Healthy People" this was the theme for the art competition.

Over 350 entries were received for the WetlandCare National Art Competition 2008. The most popular category was the Open Photography category and the Children's Art Junior, followed by Open Art and Natural History.

A major aim of the competition was to promote wetlands and the theme of World Wetlands Day 2008, "*Healthy Wetlands, Healthy People*". This proved to be a success, as evidenced by the entries received, and the broad national and regional interest in the competition from electronic, print, and audio media.

In addition, many entrants and members of the public were surprised to learn, through the art competition, about the great diversity of wetlands in Australia. Parents of child entrants commented that participating in the competition provided a valuable learning experience for their children, a fun school holiday activity, facilitated reflection on the theme and discussions about wetlands. This also resulted in a focus on local wetlands, and many visits to wetlands in the name of Art.

An award ceremony and exhibition of the winning works was held in Ballina, NSW, Australia. This was a big success, with regional dignitaries presenting awards, and prize winners travelling long distances to collect their prizes. The local mayor of Ballina Shire Council, Phillip Silver, and the federal member for Page MP, Janelle Saffin, both attended and presented awards. Aunty Bertha Kapeen from the Aboriginal Bundjalung Nation provided a Welcome to Country.
