## Regional Initiative for the conservation and sustainable use of wetlands in the Amazon River Basin

Countries: Bolivia, Brazil, Colombia, Ecuador, Guyana, Peru, Suriname and Venezuela.

**Coordination:** The coordination through a Technical Secretariat. Initially Colombia will be in charge of the Coordination Secretariat and then it will rotate every two years to each of the member countries of the initiative.

## **Main Goals:**

- 1. Contribute to the effective management of protected areas' systems.
- 2. Sustainable management of strategic ecosystems.
- 3. Maintenance of environmental goods and services.
- 4. Integrity, functionality and resilience of the Amazon Biome.

## **Activities:**

- > Evaluate the ecosystem services of the Ramsar Sites of the Amazon River Basin.
- Generate processes to include the Amazon Ramsar Sites in national planning processes, such as water resources management plans and water use plans.
- ➤ Generate a strategy for the management and exchange of cartographic and documentary information as well as sharing experiences for Ramsar Sites in the Amazon.
- Designation of new Ramsar Sites in the Amazon.
- > Develop and/or implement management and/or restoration plans for Ramsar Sites in the Amazon.
- > Incorporation of sectorial programs in wetlands conservation and/or protection processes.
- Establishment of the Regional Amazonian Wetlands System.
